Sunday school and Junior Church will kick off the new schedule on September 8 and the Wednesday morning Bible study begins a new study. Pastor Caleb and Alma are meeting regularly with a small home group and Caleb begins work on his Masters of Divinity at Asbury Seminary. Pastor Kathi will introduce a new 6 week lectionary based sermon series on God's family. You will want to be present on Sunday morning to learn more about who we can be as a community of faith.

As you read this newsletter please note where you might fit into the ministries of Whitehall UMC, as a lay servant or as a participant.
